Students from the Tri-State area will have hands on experience at the T4 – Tools, Trade, Torque and Tech summit, September 22 & 23 at the Bowman County Fairground.

Around 900 students will not only have an exciting opportunity to listen to various instructors but will see demonstrations and participate in activities related to the career choice being presented. For example, there is going to be an aeronautics simulator. Or they will get to see how to weld. Welding, aeronautics, manufacturing, precision ag, aviation/unmanned aircraft, civil engineering, health care are only a few of the careers to be presented.

Grades 10-12 will attend Wednesday and grades 7-9 will attend Thursday.

Students will gather for a general session first thing each morning. They will then break into groups. Each session will last 40 minutes, 4 times each day.

Parents and anyone interested in the event are invited to a meet & greet September 21, 5:30- 7:30 at the Bowman County Fairgrounds. They will get to visit with the coordinators and presenters as they are setting up for the next day.
