



# SOUTHWEST AREA CAREER & TECHNICAL ACADEMY

The Southwest Area CTE Academy (SW CTE) is currently a partnership of seven high schools, Dickinson State University and business and industry partners from SW ND. SW CTE is committed to reinventing the career and technical education model for SW ND as it evolves from a vocational school model to one that ladders secondary education to higher education, builds careers in skilled trades, technology and applied sciences and meets the demands for "upskilling" today's workforce. Building strong relationships between students and industry and create access to help retain our talented students.

SW CTE is currently renovating it's 40-acre campus on the north side of Dickinson that will house over 83,000 sq/ft of indoor education space and additional outdoor lab space for students to learn and apply skills for in-demand careers. "Building A" opened for classes in the spring of 2023. The second building "Building B" is slated to open its doors in the fall of 2023 with "Building C" to follow in the spring of 2024. In addition to opening up the new campus, SW CTE will provide mobile learning labs to serve each of the member high schools.
